## From the Pastor:

In the middle of August, I am attending my class reunion for the first time in over 30 years. It has become something special because one of my best friends from high school, Amy is also attending, making the trip back to PA from Portland OR, where she lived for many years. I have not seen Amy for about 40 years-she and I just never managed to be in our area of PA at the same time. There will be a lot of remembering. FYI Amy was the valedictorian of our graduating class.

I am looking forward to doing some fun remembering with Amy and some other friends soon, and this got me to thinking about remembering in the Bible. There are lots of places where we are asked to "remember." Here are just a few:

"And you shall remember the whole way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not." Deuteronomy 8:2 It was important for the Hebrew people to remember that God provided for them and led them through 40 years in the wilderness.

This is one of my favorites: "Remember the steadfast love of the Lord, for he has not consumed us; his compassions never fail; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22-23. We would all have a much better life if we could always remember this. God never leaves us, and God never stops loving us, no matter what. God is a God of compassion. Another is like it:

"My soul will be satisfied as with fat and rich food, and my mouth will praise you with joyful lips, when I remember you upon my bed, and meditate on you in the watches of the night; for you have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I will sing for joy." Psalm 63:5-7: I need to spend more time praising and being joyful! God has been my help, always.

There are dozens more, but I am going to the New Testament now in one of our two sacraments, in which we are called to "remember." The term "memory meal" accurately describes one aspect of the Lord's Supper's significance for many Christians. However, it often encompasses more than just remembrance, also pointing to present communion and future hope. And Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Luke 22: 19. How many times have we heard these in our lives? "Remember."

My hope for you as we continue our summer is that you too will "remember," because the act of remembering can be powerful. We often get busy and forget to remember how God has blessed us, how God has provided for us, how God has been with us in our dark seasons. So brothers and sisters: take some time this month to "remember."





The hymn was composed in 1868 in Elkhart, Wisconsin. The story goes that Bennett, a pharmacist wrote the lyrics rather quickly after seeing that Webster, a friend and musician who struggled with depression, needed a distraction.

Once the lyrics were handed to Webster, he reportedly composed the melody in less than 30 minutes. The hymn became very popular and remains a well-known piece of Christian music.
