1st Scripture Reading: Exodus 14: 19-31 [NRSV] Rev. Dan McKenty

The angel of God who was going before the Israelite army moved and went behind them, and the pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and took its place behind them. ²⁰ It came between the army of Egypt and the army of Israel. And so the cloud was there with the darkness, and it lit up the night; one did not come near the other all night. ²¹ Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night and turned the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. ²² The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. ²³ The Egyptians pursued and went into the sea after them, all of Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and chariot drivers. 24 At the morning watch the Lord, in the pillar of fire and cloud, looked down on the Egyptian army and threw the Egyptian army into a panic. ²⁵He clogged their chariot wheels so that they turned with difficulty. The Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the Israelites, for the Lord is fighting for them against Egypt ²⁶ Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, so that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots and chariot drivers." ²⁷ So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at dawn the sea returned to its normal depth. As the Egyptians fled before it, the Lord tossed the Egyptians into the sea. ²⁸ The waters returned and covered the chariots and the chariot drivers, the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not one of them remained. ²⁹ But the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left.³⁰ Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. ³¹ Israel saw the great work that the Lord did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the Lord and believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses.

The Watchmaker's Daughter traces the life of this outstanding Christian woman from her childhood in Haarlem (Netherlands), through her suffering in Nazi concentration camps, to her world—wide ministry to the handicapped and underprivileged.

Updated Statistics for the Ocean City Beach Patrol 2023 Season:

Last week we honored the **Ocean City Beach Patrol** for the sacrificial work they do during our busy beach seasons. As of last week, we only had the numbers for the Labor Day Weekend. Captain Butch Arbin was able to supply us with the statistics for the 2023 season (as of last week):

- ⇒ 2,038 individuals were rescued from the ocean (not all are life and death, but they all need some assistance);
- ⇒ 100,000 preventative actions were recorded. This is when the SRT (guard) uses a whistle and flags to move someone away from danger so they don't have to initiate a rescue;
- ⇒ Over **1,500** minor First Aid services were provided;
- ⇒ 220 more serious medical cases where we requested EMS;
- ⇒ The Beach Patrol is also responsible for the beach wheel chairs and recorded over **400** separate uses.
- ⇒ The Beach Patrol SRTs are also responsible for enforcing all of the laws and ordinances on the beach. This includes alcohol, dogs, smoking, ball playing, etc., and we had over 12,000 enforcement interactions this season. Smoking accounted for over 4,000 and alcohol was another major issue.

Captain Arbin also called our attention to the fact that the first official activity they do each season is a public Prayer Service at 7AM on the Saturday on Memorial Day Weekend.

He added that they are most grateful for our prayers.
