Joseph M. Scriven, an Irish immigrant to Canada, wrote "What a Friend" near Port Hope, Ontario, in 1855. Because his life was filled with grief and trials, Scriven often needed the solace of the Lord as described in his famous hymn.

Do you think our good old hymns were readily accepted when they were first written? Think again! That should give us pause for the new hymns coming out!

The hymn "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" was written by Joseph M. Scriven in 1855 as a poem to comfort his mother. The poem was first published anonymously and was not widely known or attributed to Scriven for many years.

The poem was first published in 1865 without Scriven's name. It gained popularity after Charles C. Converse set it to music in 1868 and was included in Ira Sankey's "Gospel Hymns and Sacred Songs" in 1875. Sankey initially attributed the hymn to Horatius Bonar, and it took until the 1880s for Scriven's authorship to be correctly recognized.

The hymn received some criticism for its poetic quality. Albert Bailey noted the monotonous rhymes and language, calling it "doggerel". Bailey also acknowledged that the hymn's message has helped many.

The Handbook to the Lutheran Hymnal mentions criticism of the hymn and its tune for being "too much on the order of the sentimental gospel type" but also notes its continued popularity. The tune was also criticized as dull.

In summary, the hymn's author remained unknown for a long time, and it received criticism for its writing and music.

However, its message of finding comfort in Jesus through prayer resonated with many people, leading to its widespread and lasting popularity.


