

~ A basket of Red White and Blue flowers is placed to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II, in memory of the 50-60 million people who died as a result of the War, and in honor and memory of all the men and women who served in the US armed forces during the War. Especially our Dad, Irv Mumford, and his brothers, Paul and Bill (Navy), our grandfather, Irv, Sr. (Merchant Marine), and our great uncles, Charlie and Henry Ackerman (Army). Japan announced its unconditional surrender on August 15, 1945. On August 27, Dad's ship, the USS YMS 276 (minesweeper) was the 8th ship to enter Tokyo Bay to do a protective sweep of the harbor prior to the arrival of the Allied fleet. On September 2, 1945, the formal surrender was signed on the deck of the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay. Dad had the privilege of being able to observe the ceremony from the deck of his own ship.
