# THE MEANING OF ADVENT

The word "advent" means "coming" or "arrival." Advent is composed of the 4 Sundays prior to Christmas when we prepare our hearts and minds to receive God's gift of Jesus Christ. Just as Lent prepares us for Easter, so Advent is a time for us to reflect on what needs to be changed in our lives as we hear John the Baptist preach his message

of repentance and prepare ourselves for Christmas. We cannot celebrate Christmas without first celebrating Advent. The Christmas songs playing on the radio and in stores serve only to remind us that our spiritual holiday is not based on the values of the secular world. Advent must happen before Christmas, and there are Advent hymns in all church hymnals to celebrate this time of preparation and reflection. Christians have a very distinct agenda in Advent, very different from our commercial environment. We need to acknowledge our yearning for God, undertake our repentance, and ponder who this one is for whom we wait. We need this time of preparation before we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior. The waiting has begun.

C. Austin Miles wrote both the lyrics and music for the popular hymn "In the Garden". His trade was as a pharmacist but after some success as a songwriter he pursued this vocation. In his own words, here is how he came to write this favorite hymn:

One day in March, 1912, I was seated in the dark-room, where I kept my photographic equipment and organ. I drew my Bible toward me; it opened at my favorite chapter, John XX—whether by chance or inspiration let each reader decide. That meeting of Jesus and Mary had lost none of its power to charm. As I read it that day, I seemed to be part of the scene. I became a silent witness to that dramatic moment in Mary's life, when she knelt before her Lord, and cried, "Rabboni!"

My hands were resting on the Bible while I stared at the light blue wall. As the light faded I seemed to be standing at the entrance of a garden, looking down a gently winding path, shaded by olive branches. A woman in white, with head bowed, hand clasping her throat, as if to choke back her sobs, walked slowly into the shadows. It was Mary. As she came to the tomb, upon which she placed her hand, she bent over to look in and hurried away.

John, in flowing robe, appeared, looking at the tomb; then came Peter, who entered the tomb, followed slowly by John. As they departed, Mary reappeared, leaning her head upon her arm at the tomb, she wept. Turning herself, she saw Jesus standing, so did I. I knew it was He. She knelt before Him, with arms outstretched and looking into His face cried, "Rabboni!"

I awakened in full light, gripping the Bible, with muscles tense and nerves vibrating. Under the inspiration of this vision I wrote as quickly as the words could be formed the poem exactly as it has since appeared. That same evening I wrote the music.








# **GOOD BYE, TRACY AND BEST WISHES!!**

### ISAIAH PASSAGES FOR SERMONS OF ADVENT



Pastor Debbie will be preaching on the texts from the Old Testament book of Isaiah during the 4 Sundays of Advent. The Book of Isaiah is particularly appropriate for us to read during Advent for several reasons: Prophecies of the Messiah: Isaiah contains numerous prophecies about the coming of the Messiah, which we believe were fulfilled in Jesus Christ. We will still hear the

Gospel text read along with the Epistle for that day. The Psalm will be the Call to Worship from a site called The Timeless Psalms.

### FLOWERS FOR ADVENT

During the month of December, we decorate our sanctuary with poinsettias. The first 3 weeks of Advent are covered with dedications. But it is not too late to order and dedicate the 6" pots of poinsettias that will fill the poinsettia tree in the back of the sanctuary.
