

Quotes on Micah 6:8 often highlight the verse's call to justice, mercy, and humility, with thinkers like Cornel West calling it "the trinity of the moral life" and Abraham Joshua Heschel referring to it as "the Magna Carta of prophetic religion". The verse itself, "He has shown you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?" serves as a profound challenge for believers to live out their faith through ethical action rather than mere ritual.


Call to Worship: Elder Vicky Cairns


